1 Day Trip to Chinatown from Shin-Yokohama

From the gateway of Yokohama to a world-class Chinatown

This is a route to view the main sightseeing spots in the Shin-Yokohama area such as Nissan Stadium and the Shin-Yokohama Ramen Museum from Kozukue Station on JR Yokohama Line, and followed up with traveling by train from Shin-Yokohama Station to enjoy Yokohama Chinatown. There is a route which starts at Shin-Yokohama Station, but this itinerary does require traveling uphill, so this route which starts from Kozukue Station is recommended especially for wheelchair users and the elderly as the roads are either downhill or level. When using trains, please keep in mind that there are elevators at all the stations: Kozukue Station, Shin-Yokohama Station, Kikuna Station (used for changing trains), and Motomachi-Chukagai Station on the Minatomirai Line (destination). The Chinatown area is an itinerary which starts and ends at Motomachi-Chukagai Station and is filled with food, souvenirs, and experiences.

Route



Description of the pictograms

This map was created for the purpose of enabling elderly and disabled people to comfortably enjoy sightseeing in Yokohama. It contains information related to barrier-free areas and sites to see on the courses. We hope that this information will help you to determine what route you would like to take in order to enjoy sightseeing at your own pace.

- Wheelchair accessible toilets are available.
- Ostomate supported facilities are available.
- Facilities with nappy changing sheets, breastfeeding space, and other items that support infants are available.
- Writing board or paper is available to support written communication.
- Descriptions with braille and/or tactile pictures are available.
- Facilities allowing you to sit and have a rest, such as benches, are available.

START at JR Kozukue Sta.

Course starting from Shin-Yokohama Station
 This course take you from Shin-Yokohama Station to Nissan Stadium via the West Gate bridge. It goes around the stadium and back toward the station from the East Gate bridge. The West Gate bridge is a wide and easy to walk on footpath. Once you enter the stadium premises, use the access ramp or elevator to get onto the 4th floor ring path.

Shin-Yokohama Station Tourist Information Center
 On the floor of the ticket gate at Shin-Yokohama Station, this center provides tourist and event information, pamphlets, and other tourism-related information. They also offer a luggage holding service (800 yen per item per day) and we recommend you take advantage of this service so you can walk around Yokohama without any luggage.

Go to Motomachi-Chukagai Station by train.

From Kozukue Station to Nissan Stadium, a well-maintained, safe footpath runs along a road with low traffic.

Enter the premises once again from the marathon gate, and use the elevator diagonally to the right to get to the ring path on the 4th floor.

When you reach the East Gate square, go onto the East Gate bridge to your right. This is a gentle and easy downhill walk.

Go to the Hamatoribashi intersection from the East Gate bridge. Note that there is quite a lot of traffic here. The footpath along the river after you cross the bridge is easy to walk and recommended.

Turn right onto the approach to the white, pedestrians-only Sankaku Bridge.

This section is a pedestrian bridge. It is a moderate slope.

Using this elevator and going up to the pedestrian bridge makes it easy to go in the direction of Shin-Yokohama Station.

There are stairs to the front of the West Gate. To use the elevator to go up the West Gate, leave the stadium premises, go onto the footpath, and turn right.

To get down, use the elevator or access ramp that is a gentle slope.

This elevator goes to the municipal subway.

To use the escalator or elevator to go to the station ticket gates, go to the path in front and to your left.

Nissan Stadium (International Stadium Yokohama / Shin-Yokohama Park)

Chosen to host the final of the 2002 FIFA World Cup and Rugby World Cup 2019™, this stadium is a symbol of Japan. You can walk through it even on days when there are no events, and tours are also available (reservations required).

- Free admission to the outside of the stadium, admission charged to enter the inside (price differs by event)
- Feel free to enter the outside of the stadium (restrictions apply depending on event)
- Feel free to enter the outside of the stadium (Administrations office is closed Tuesdays)

There are special areas for wheelchair users that is easy to watch matches inside the stadium. You can move about freely outside the stadium also using the elevators and there are two multi-purpose toilets at the East and West Gates.

SHINYOKOHAMA RAUMEN MUSEUM

The museum, which replicates the "good old Showa" streetscape, is a food amusement park that allows you to enjoy the tastes of famous ramen restaurants from around Japan. There is also a gallery about ramen and a museum shop.

Note that the paths, which are retro alleys, have creaky floors and are narrow in places. Ask the staff to guide you to wheelchair-accessible toilets.

Places to visit around Shin-Yokohama Station

CUBICPLAZA Shin-yokohama

This building connects directly to the Shin-Yokohama station building and has large stores such as Bic Camera, Takashimaya Food Maison, Loft, and Uniqlo. There are also restaurants on the 9th and 10th floors, and a Gourmet Street on the 1st floor for those that are hungry.

There is a multi-purpose toilet on the 9th floor and an infant facility on the 6th floor.

YOKOHAMA ARENA

Boasting a maximum capacity of 17,000 people, this multi-purpose event hall has hosted the concerts of many famous artists and sports events. Its major features are the various types of stages that can be rendered and the movable audience seating.

There are four wheelchair-accessible toilets on the 1st and 2nd floors, of which two support ostomates. The corridors inside the premises have an effective width of 1.9 meters or more and there are no steps.

Shin Yokohama Prince pepe




There is a multi-purpose toilet and a baby restroom on the 3rd floor. There is a writing board for communication at the Seibu Prince Club counter on the 1st floor. There are rest benches on each floor.

Direct service from Tokyu Toyoko Line to Minatomirai Line



The main street, Chukagai Odori, is closed to cars from 12:00 to 20:00 every day. Free Wi-Fi is also available.

Go out Exit 2 and turn left. If you turn left at Choyo-mon, you are now in Chinatown.

Go out the ticket gate for Chinatown and Yamashita Park at Motomachi-Chukagai Station, and head to Exit 2.

After getting off the train at Motomachi-Chukagai Station, go around Chinatown!

Change trains from the JR Yokohama Line to the Tokyu Toyoko Line at Kikuna Station.

Yokohama Omoshiro Aquarium

You can learn about the ecology of fish through this aquarium's unique exhibition methods. Enjoy a relaxing time observing the marine life.

There is a children's toilet inside the aquarium and a wheelchair-accessible toilet on the 1st floor of the building. There is a fee for using the 1st floor toilet, but it is waived if you show your admission ticket.

YOKOHAMA HAKURANKAN

This is a popular tourist spot that has Baby-Star Land and the largest Yokohama souvenir shop in Chinatown.

The multi-purpose toilet on the 3rd floor supports ostomates and has a nappy changing seat. The café has a terrace, which is perfect for a break.

YOKOHAMA DAISEKAI

This facility has Yokohama souvenir shops, a museum, fortune-telling, and other attractions.

- Free admission. Charge for admission to the Art Trick Museum on the 4th to 8th floors, but children three years of age or younger are free, and those with a certificate of disability and the person accompanying them get a 30% discount
- The Yokohama Daisekai Market (souvenir shop) on the 1st floor: 9:30 to 21:30 (Fridays, Saturdays, and the days before a holiday are open until 22:00); Art Trick Museum on the 4th to 8th floors: 10:00 to 20:00 (Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays are open until 20:30; last admission is 45 minutes before the facility closes); operating hours differ by store for stores on the 3rd floor comfort floor ☒ None

If you ask the staff, they will place an access ramp on the 1st floor steps and guide you to the elevator to get to the 2nd and higher floors.

Station information

JR Kozukue Sta.

This station is the closest station to Nissan Stadium and is on the local Yokohama Line. There are elevators on both the inbound and outbound train platforms that go to the ticket gate floor and there is also a wheelchair-accessible toilet. To go to Nissan Stadium, go out the ticket gates and head toward the North Exit on your left.



Going out the ticket gate will take you to the north-south access way. It is wide and also convenient as a meeting place.

JR Shin-Yokohama Sta.

This station is the gateway to Yokohama serviced by the Tokaido Shinkansen, Yokohama Line, and Yokohama Municipal Subway Blue Line. The pedestrian bridges around the station and the platforms inside the station all have elevators. There are also several wheelchair-accessible toilets and a wide-range of barrier-free facilities.



A pedestrian bridge extends from the North Exit on the 2nd floor, and places around the station are connected by elevators.

JR/Tokyu Toyoko Line Kikuna Sta.

This station is used for changing between the Yokohama Line and the Tokyu Toyoko Line, with the two lines being connected by elevators and barrier-free corridors. Riding at the back of the train from Shibuya when changing to the Toyoko Line will enable you to smoothly move to Chinatown after you get off the train at Motomachi-Chukagai.



The elevator at the back of the station after entering the Toyoko Line ticket gates is for the train going to Motomachi-Chukagai Station.

Minatomirai Line Motomachi-Chukagai Sta.

This is the last stop on the Minatomirai Line that operates through with the Tokyu Toyoko Line. The platform is on the 4th floor underground and you need to use three elevators to get above ground. There is also a long underground corridor between the second and third elevators.



Exit 3 of the Chinatown Exit does not have an elevator, so use Exit 2 of the Yamashitacho Exit.
