Sail training ship NIPPON MARU Yokohama Port Museum

The sailing ship NIPPON MARU was built in 1930 as a training ship. After it was decommissioned in 1984, it was invited to permanently berth in Yokohama and is now open to the public. It was designated as a National Important Cultural Property in 2017. The Yokohama Port Museum focuses on the Port of Yokohama and has the Yanagihara Ryohei Art Museum inside the museum.

There are multi-purpose toilets that support breastfeeding and ostemate inside Yokohama Minato Museum and wheelchairs are also available for hire. There is also an access ramp inside the museum.

YOKOHAMA RED BRICK WAREHOUSE

The No. 2 building was built in 1911 and the No. 1 building in 1913. The buildings were used to temporarily store goods imported from foreign countries until import procedures were completed. The buildings stopped being used in 1989 and were reborn in 2002 as commercial facilities.

The building entrance has an access ramp. While there are bumpy and uneven stone paths in the park, they do not pose an obstacle to wheelchairs. Wheelchair hire is also available.

Zou-No-Hana Terrace

This is an art space and rest house inside Zou-No-Hana Park built to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the opening of the Yokohama Port. As two levees which were built in part of the park when the port was opened resemble an elephant's nose when seen from above, this area is called the "zou-no-hana" (elephant's nose).

An access ramp has been built on the outside stairs. Braille guide boards (tactile signs) are located on the Zo-no-Hana Terrace, inside the toilets, and on the outdoor guide board. There is also an information desk at Zo-no-Hana Terrace.

Yamashita Park

The view of Yokohama Bay Bridge and ships passing each other in the harbor is romantic. The park is also famous for its many monuments that remind us of Yokohama's rich exchange with foreign countries, such as the "Statue of the Girl with Red Shoes" that many people would be familiar with from the nursery rhyme "Akai Kutsu", "The Indian Drinking Fountain" donated by the local Indian community, and "The Guardian of Water" donated by Yokohama's sister city, San Diego.

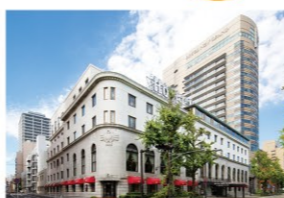

You can use the elevator from the B1 and 1st floor parking area to the World Plaza (roof). Wheelchairs (5 available; 09:00-16:30) are available for rent to users of the Yamashita Park parking lot.

HOTEL NEW GRAND

Opened in 1927, this is Yokohama's only classic hotel. The Main Building, which remains unchanged since the hotel opened, is certified as a "Yokohama City Historical Building" and a "Heritage of Industrial Modernization". "The Cafe" on the first floor of the Main Building serves Napolitan spaghetti and other dishes that were invented at the hotel.

As the entrance to the Main Building has steps, please use the automatic door at the entrance to the tower. Wheelchair-accessible restrooms are located on the first floor of the Main Building. Reservations required by phone for the fully accessible room.

YOKOHAMA DOLL MUSEUM

This is a collection of more than 10,000 dolls from over 100 countries and regions. All age groups can enjoy a wide range of exhibits of Japanese Living National Treasure works, anime, character dolls, and figurines. There are also puppet shows and workshops about creating dolls.

An elevator is available for use from the parking area to the entrance, and to each floor. Multi-purpose toilets for disabled persons are available next to the standard toilets on floors 1, 2, and 4.

Minato-no-mieru Oka Koen

On a hill that overlooks the Port of Yokohama, Minato-no-mieru Oka Koen is known as a great place to see the Yokohama Bay Bridge. The Yokohama English Garden, which was refurbished in April, 2016, has about 800 plants of 190 types of roses, and seasonal flowers bloom as if in competition with each other.



You can get to the observation deck via an access ramp. There are two unisex multi-purpose toilets at the park entrance and you can choose which toilet to use depending on whether you have right or left-side paralysis. The toilets also have a urinal for infants, a baby holder, and a nappy changing station.

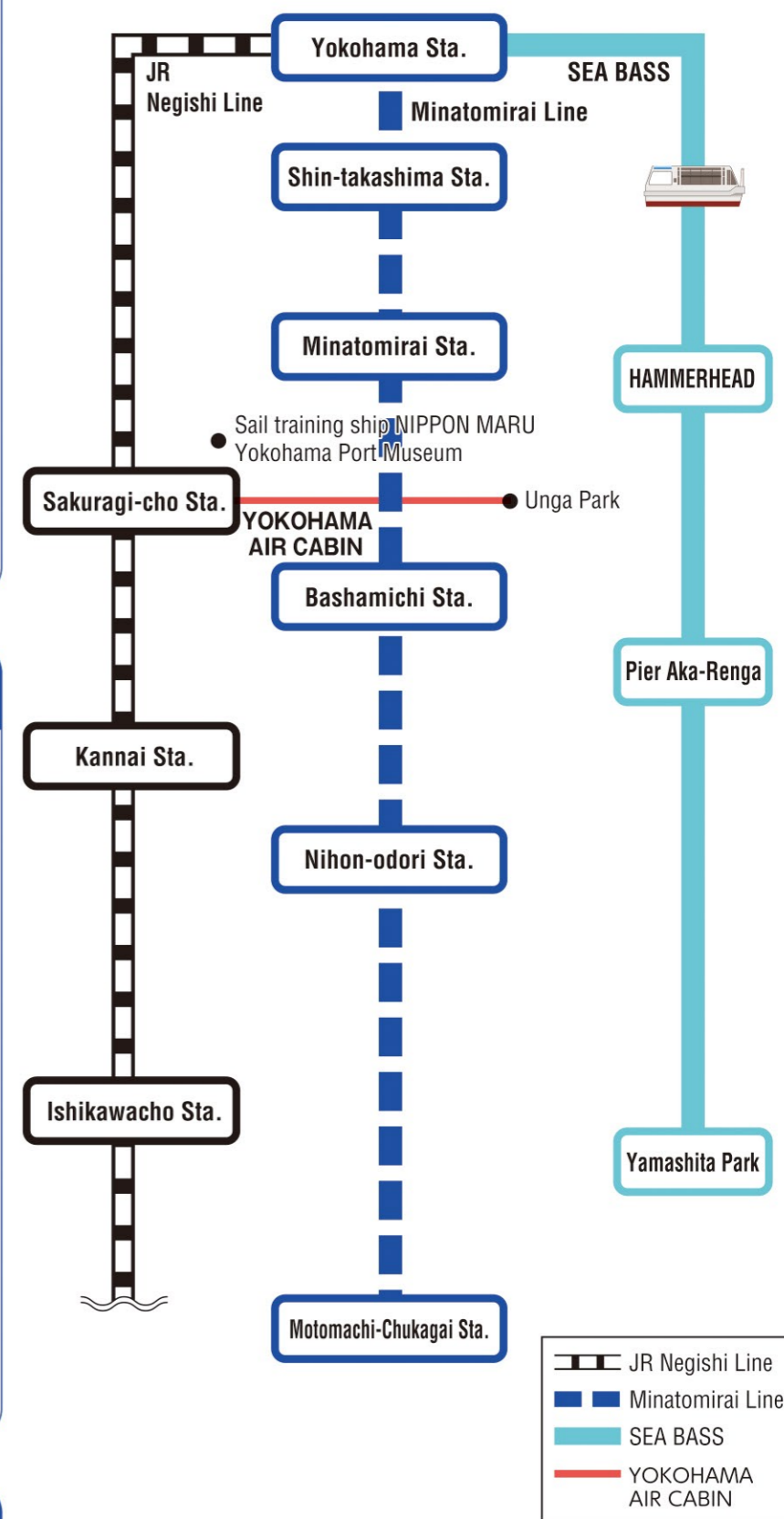

YOKOHAMA AIR CABIN

Japan's first permanent urban ropeway connecting Sakuragicho Station and Unga Park Station. You can enjoy the view of the Minato Mirai 21 district from a high vantage point while moving around the area. (630 m one-way, approx. 5 min.) Lighting effects create a new nighttime landscape. The ropeway is barrier-free, enabling wheelchair users easy access. The gondolas are air-conditioned for comfort even in summer.

SEA BASS

This water bus service connects the East Exit of Yokohama Station to Yokohama Hammerhead, Pier Akarenga, and Yamashita Park. Although there are stairs at the entrance of the ferry, the friendly staff will help wheelchair users to get onto the ferry. City Loop Bus "Akai Kutsu"

This bus traverses the Yokohama Bay area centering on Sakuragicho Station. The bus has no steps and space for two wheelchairs. For details, please check the website.
